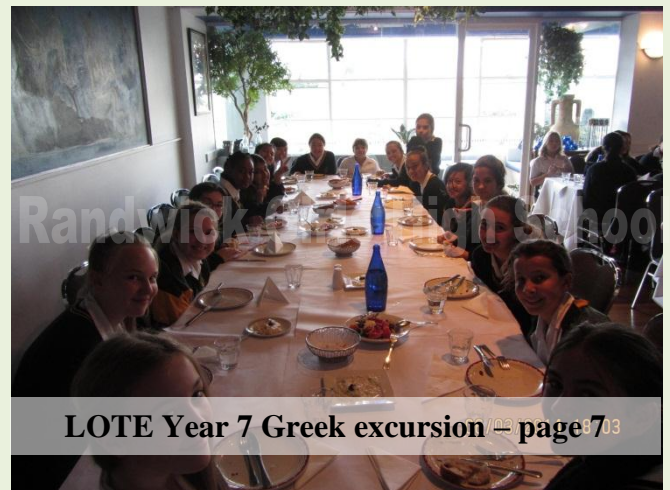

My name is Emily and I finished Year 12 at Randwick Girls High last year. I have a genetic disorder called Hereditary Spastic Paraparesis and I have been in a wheelchair from the age of 7. I have always enjoyed sport, gymnastics in kindergarten and high school, tennis in primary school, wheelchair basketball on and off since I was 7, and over the last few years I have been going to the gym. In Year 10, Wheelchair Sports Road Show came to Randwick Girls and my class got to experience basketball in a wheelchair and found it's not as easy as it looks. I currently play in a basketball league.

In January, I watched the Oz Day - 10K Wheelchair Road Race at The Rocks. It was great to watch and after the race meet some of the Australian Paralympians and Kurt Fearnley. I was excited to meet them and very impressed with what I saw, it inspired me to start track myself. I started training at the gym, for upper body strengthening and track training using a loan track wheelchair from Wheelchair Sports. I entered my first 10km race at Homebush in May and won bronze. I have been asked to enter the 2016 Rio Paralympic Games and I am very determined to qualify and go.

I am looking forward to a Track Wheelchair that will work properly, ride smoothly and will allow me to push faster. I am looking forward to my times coming down and the races ahead.



SUBJECT CHOICES – 2015

In Term 3, 2014, many students at Randwick Girls High School will be involved in selecting subjects to study in 2015. It is important that parents and students actively participate in this process, as it will ensure that students select the appropriate subjects for their future educational needs. Some important dates are:

Tuesday 29 July (period 4)

Year 8 students will be given information to take home to assist them to make selections relating to the study of three elective subjects in 2015. These three electives will be studied in Year 9 (2015) and TWO of them will also be continued in Year 10 (2016).

Tuesday 29 July (7.00pm)

All Year 10 students and their parents/guardians are invited to attend a Subject Choice Evening in the school's MPC in order to receive important information related to their senior studies in 2015, 2016.

Wednesday 30 July (period 2)

Year 9 students will be asked to indicate the two elective subjects they would prefer to continue studying in 2015.

Wednesday 30 July (period 3)

Year 11 students will be asked to review the Pattern of Study they wish to pursue next year, in preparation for the 2015 HSC Examinations.

At each of these meetings information related to course content, subject requirements, assessment tasks, subject fees and student responsibilities will be supplied, as well as Subject Choice survey forms. It is very important that students use all possible information, including latest school reports, to select their subjects. It is also essential that they complete and return all subject selection forms by the indicated due date, as this will allow the school to begin planning for 2015.

RUNNING GROUP

Randwick Girls High School has formed a school running group for students interested in improving their middle/long distance running ability, who are preparing to represent the school at community running events (eg City2Surf), are training for cross country and athletics carnivals, or who are looking to develop increased cardiovascular endurance.

The group is supervised and trained by Ms Neyland, and runs at Centennial Park on specified weekends. Students meet at the corner of Grand Drive and Dickens Drive at 9 am on the scheduled days, where they train for approximately 1 hour.

All participants are required to wear suitable clothing and running shoes, as well as bring a water bottle for rehydration and some food to consume at the completion of the training session (fruit, muesli bar, etc). Students who join the team also have the opportunity to purchase a team singlet (\$15).

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN LANGUAGES

Year 8 Enrichment Day

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Year 10 Food for Celebrations

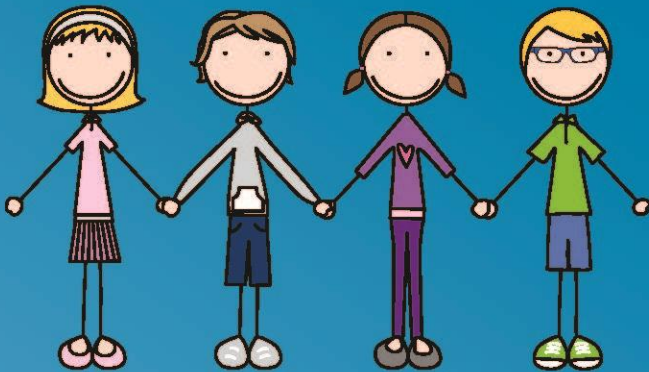

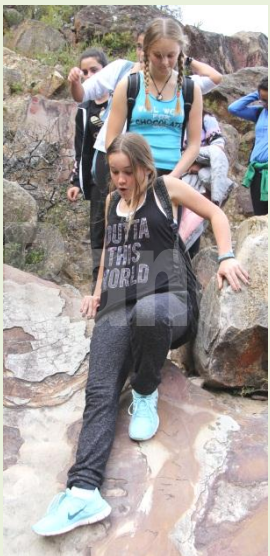
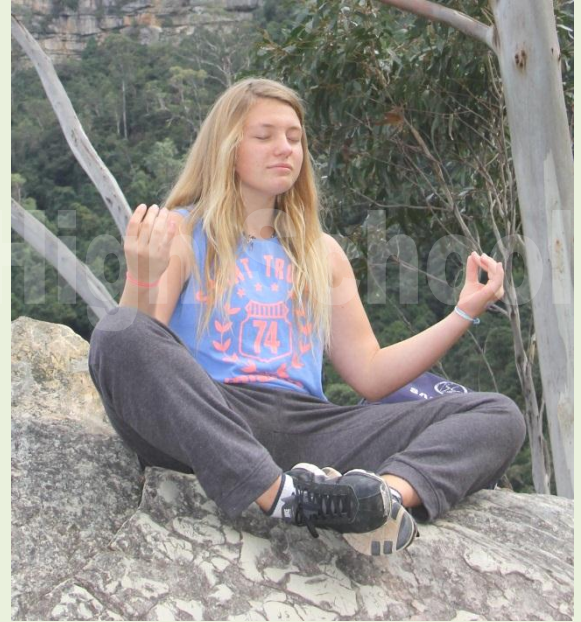
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BLUE MOUNTAINS BUSHWALK

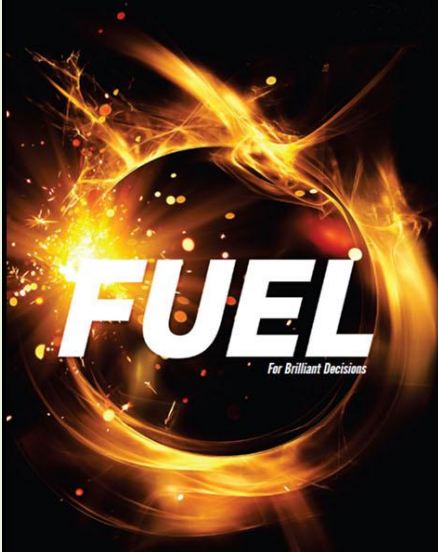

Randwick Girls' *uniform news*

The winter season is now well and truly here and all girls should be in winter uniform with jumpers, blazers or the school sports wind jacket which may be worn with the full school uniform.

Our checked skirt is a warm alternative to the plain coloured senior and junior summer skirts and looks very attractive with the uniform thick black stockings.

All skirts should be no more than 10cms above the knee.

If desired the girls can also wear the school regulation green trousers (**never black**).

The school jumper under the school blazer is a very warm option and will last for a number of years.

Alternative cardigans, sweat tops, tights or sport skins are never the uniform.

Girls can also wear a long sleeve white collared school shirt under the jumper for added warmth, or in case of itch.

Girls wear full uniform to school every other day and change for PE.
