Projects varied from each focus area, including stunning wall hangings, dresses and bags. Students enjoyed hearing from senior Textiles and Design marker Linda Parsons and others employed in the textiles industry.

On Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March, Year 11 Design and Technology Students attend the SHAPE 2015 seminar at the Powerhouse Museum. The day was filled with two industry guest speakers who gave students real world insights into the design industry. The Powerhouse education team lead students through a creative activity where they used CAD software to design and print a personal logo onto a sticker.

Students also viewed innovative design projects from 2015 HSC graduates. The exhibition section brings together HSC projects from Design and Technology, Industrial Technology and Textiles and Design. Projects varied from a kitchen tool that allows Parkinson's patients to gain independence to a regency-style jacket inspired by the sea and a virtual reality video game that takes users through the ages of human history. **YR 11 ENTERTAINMENT INDUSTRY** students successfully completed their *White Card* training, for Work Safety in the Construction

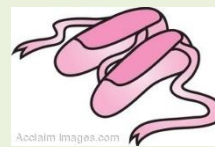

# ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

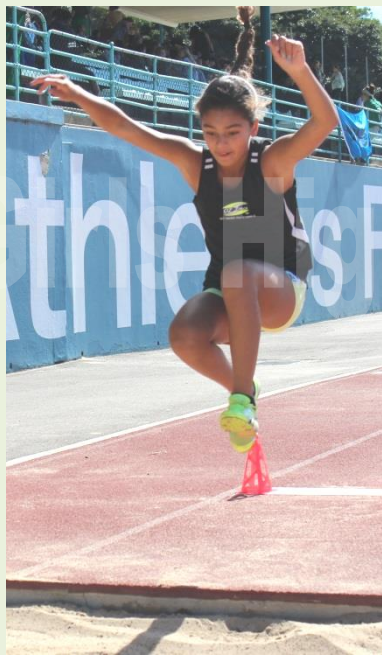

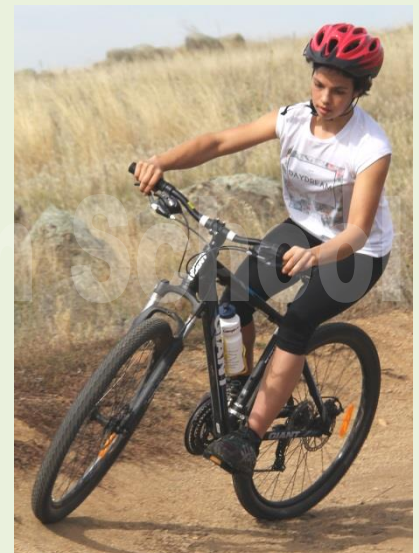
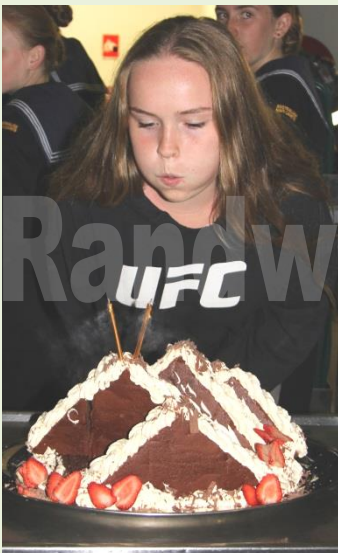


# JINDABYNE – 2016
