

PD/HEALTH/PE Happenings...

YEAR 12 PD/HEALTH/PE classes have just completed their assessment task program for *Health Priorities in Australia*. They are now embarking on a new topic area where they will investigate the classification, treatment, management and prevention of *Sports Injuries*.

YEAR 11 PD/HEALTH/PE classes have begun studying *The Body in Motion*, where they will investigate the body systems and how they work together to produce high performance. CAREERS NEWS

My first term as the Careers Adviser at Randwick Girls' High School has certainly been a busy one! During this term I have very much enjoyed the opportunity of supporting our students to participate in a broad variety of Career related activities. A number of our Year 11 students commenced TAFE vocational education courses as part of their HSC studies through TAFE NSW. Every Tuesday afternoon during term our students attend a range of courses in areas such as Health Services, Fitness, Music, Baking, Real Estate, Early Childhood Education and Design across the Sydney Institute Colleges at Randwick, Ultimo, St George and Enmore Design Centre.

Five Year 11 students also commenced a School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship (SBAT). A SBAT allows students to combine school, training and paid work whilst working towards an industry recognised national qualification and their HSC. One of our Year 11 students Christina Suarez featured on the front page of the Sydney Morning Herald on the very first day of her Civil Construction School Based Apprenticeship working at Sydney Metro.

Year 10 students with a keen interest in Careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) had the opportunity to participate in two very inspiring events. On Friday the 9th of February 2018 I accompanied twenty students to the Women In STEM Workshop, hosted by Medical Oncologist Dr Jodi Lynch at the St George Hospital Research and Education Centre. Our students had the opportunity to hear about the Careers of leading women who hold top medical and research positions at St George Hospital. In addition students

heard from other inspiring role models working in STEM fields such as doctors, nurses, medical students, allied health professionals and academic staff from the University of New South Wales. Overall a very enjoyable day was had by all and our students left feeling very inspired to pursue a career in one of the STEM areas. Students are pictured with below with Medical staff.



On Friday the 23rd of March 2018 I accompanied another group of students to the Women in Science Symposium at the Australian Maritime Museum. This event organised by the Australian Maritime Museum together with the University of NSW and Science 50:50 aimed to encourage female high school students to see the many possibilities for Careers in Science, participate in a mini science fair and explore the museum.

Students heard from some very inspiring women in various fields of Science such as Sarah Reeves from the Museum of Applied Arts and Sciences (The Powerhouse Museum). Her expertise is in Astronomy and Science Communication and she holds a Bachelor of Science majoring in Physics and Chemistry, and a PhD in Astronomy, from the University of Sydney. For her thesis Sarah studied how galaxies grow and evolve over billions of years using giant radio telescopes like Parkes (The Dish). While studying, she also worked as a tour guide at Sydney Observatory where she discovered a passion for science communication. She now enjoys sharing her love of science with a much wider audience, through the Museum's exhibitions.

Some of our students share their experiences of the Science Symposium below:

Isabella Gainfort:

The Women in Science Symposium at the Maritime Museum made me want to pursue a career in science, because of the stories and the excitement the five women from different scientific careers had for their careers. I also enjoyed the Antarctica Exhibition at the Museum, because it was very interactive and had incredible stories of people from the Antarctic.

Eve Hudson:

The experience of the Women in Science Symposium opened my eyes to numerous possibilities of career paths in STEM that I hadn't considered before. One of the many speakers who was a Data Analyst, shared her intriguing career which provided a stable job and allowed her financially to work for a non-profit organisation that helps others in need. This also greatly captivated my attention for I had never thought of a career involving both mathematics and science before. Overall throughout the whole day, I learned that many careers start in unexpected places and can lead to various paths that you probably have never contemplated before.

Julia McLennan:

I was delighted to be able to attend this excursion because of how it opened up my eyes to many different opportunities that I could look for within the fields of science.

NEWMARKET UPDATE

Ganellan have advised that the following works will be completed over the coming weeks:

Piling, excavation and anchoring works east of Young Street will be continued. Excavators and piling rigs will be used for these tasks, and there will be an increase in truck movements.

In addition to excavation and piling, 28 Young street and 21 Jane Street are to be demolished. These works will be carefully undertaken by a professional team using excavators, and dust suppression systems will be implemented. In finalising demolition, all debris will be taken and stockpiled away from all neighbouring boundaries.

Some of the fig trees east of Young Street will be pruned slightly, and the camphor trees along the southern boundary will be removed. The pruning of trees will be conducted in alignment with the conditions of the development consent, under the supervision of a Randwick City Council representative, and a certified arborist.

FRESH WATER

Last year the P&C was successful in securing a grant to purchase some new bubblers and chilled water refill stations to improve student amenities. We are thrilled to advise that these were recently installed.

Students now have access to two chilled refill stations and two bubblers next to the quad and another two chilled double refill stations on level one near the canteen. The refill stations are also fitted with display panels which will be used to showcase our students' fabulous artworks.

Many thanks to Dean Slattery from the Department's Assets Unit for his assistance in coordinating the installation.



BASKETBALL COURTS REFRESH

In addition to the bubblers/water chillers grant, the P&C also secured grant funding to renovate the basketball courts.

The court line markings were repainted and hoop backing boards replaced.

Grants for these two projects totalled \$25,000.



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


