NAPLAN is a point-intime assessment, that allows parents and schools to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy, against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. The data from NAPLAN is one of the tools that teachers use to understand your child's progress and plan for their teaching and learning.

Students will require headphones for their NAPLAN so please remind your child to bring their headphones to school each day.

Research shows that effective feedback has a significant effect on learning outcomes, and the teachers at Randwick Girls do a wonderful job in providing targeted, timely and constructive feedback for this very reason. Students in all years should adopt practices post exam or assignment involving a systematic review of their work, with reference to the feedback provided by teachers, as well as to the marking rubric/criteria for the task. Adopting such a growth mindset is a great way to ensure that you are continuously improving your knowledge and skills and incorporating post assessment practices is one practical way of doing this. If in doubt, speak to your teacher and clarify any areas which you are unsure about.

This coming Monday 13 March sees RGHS host its annual Careers Market and UAC presentation, and I encourage all students in Years 11 and 12 to attend. This is an opportunity to hear first-hand from presenters from UAC on the process behind calculation of the ATAR, matters related to the attainment of a HSC, as well as demystify issues related to these areas. The event starts at 5pm, and special thanks goes to our Careers Advisor Ms Evers for organising this amazing evening.

Finally, on Tuesday 14 March our school will be hosting our annual Open Night. Maintaining a safe environment in our school toilets

Randwick Girls' High School is committed to providing a clean and safe environment for all students. This is also important in relation to the toilet facilities. In addition, we are also committed to providing a private space for all students in the toilets.

The school has committed extensive funds to upgrading both the junior and senior toilets to a high standard. It is expected that all students will demonstrate respect for other students and the facilities by leaving the toilets as clean as they have found them. It is also an expectation that students respect the privacy of others by using the toilets as they are intended and not as a place for congregation.

To ensure this, several measures have been implemented including the use of a classroom monitoring sign out system and the use of a toilet pass.

Why are we doing this?

We take the safety of our students seriously and classroom teachers have a responsibility to always know the whereabouts of all students. We anticipate that the use of the monitoring sheets will help students maintain school facilities to a higher standard for the comfort and safety of all students.

As educators we are committed to maximising class time for student learning and ensuring that our students learn to prioritise their health between breaks. The toilet monitoring procedure has been implemented to help students to adjust to the realities of the working world and develop positive working and learning habits.

Our students will be asked to fill in a survey about the school toilets. This will help us to ascertain a clear understanding of our students views and uncover any areas for improvement.

Introducing Hebrew to RGHS





This has been a historic year for Randwick Girls High School and the LOTE Faculty with the exciting introduction of the teaching of Hebrew in Year 7 following a suggestion to introduce this by Ms Andre last year.

To my mind, we are the only state high school in the Eastern Suburbs so far offering Hebrew on site as part of our school program.

I feel both honoured and privileged to have been asked to teach Hebrew at RGHS this year having previously done so at Emanuel School and Masada College and being extremely fortunate to have majored in both Hebrew and History at university.

We have seven Year 7 students studying Hebrew at present. Our program utilizes the Ulpan Or system, which is used in a number of Jewish Day schools internationally, including here in Sydney, and is primarily intended to give our students a taste of getting oriented in Hebrew starting with day to day question and answer conversational Hebrew such as, for example, saying one's name in Hebrew following being asked in Hebrew, "What is your name, where do you live, what is your phone number" etc, in addition to familiarising students with day to day conversational Hebrew such as ordering food, counting numbers in Hebrew, identifying colours, body parts, nouns and verbs, Hebrew letters and vowels etc.

The aim is to provide our students with an exciting and dynamic Hebrew language learning experience integrating the teaching of Hebrew songs and dance in order to provide the student with a unique contemporary "hands on" and experiential atmosphere in the classroom and to give the student an

intuitive and useful understanding and the ability to use necessary expressions so that they can feel more at home with both speaking, reading and writing Modern Hebrew as a "living" language.

At the same time, the program is designed to blend in with the LOTE faculty's NESA designed language program in the teaching at our school of our other languages such as French, Chinese and Japanese etc.

The Hebrew program, being in its infancy and pioneering stages, is naturally a developing and evolving one, with future plans being to integrate Ulpan Or's outstanding digital resources which include exciting digital audio visual material, flash card mobile applications, in class and at home assignments, test yourself quizlets etc, all of which are easily downloadable as PDF files onto smartphones, tablets or apps in order to give students a 21st century teaching and learning experience.

So why learn Hebrew in the first place?

With its right-to-left writing system and a curious-looking square alphabet, modern Hebrew seems to be a challenging language to learn at first glance. And although it certainly has some novelty elements (like

every other language), there's an abundance of fantastic reasons why one should learn Hebrew!

Hebrew is an ancient yet modern language with an amazing history dating back more than 3,000 years, making it an exciting example of a classic language revived as a modern "living" language. While being steeped in antiquity, the Hebrew language only surfaced as a modern spoken language just over a century ago. Learning the language enables our students to gain an appreciation and understanding of its long history in a fun and dynamic manner in the classroom.



Finally, learning Hebrew is a personal challenge. With its unique right to left writing format, a separate vowel and consonant system and a gender differentiation of nouns, verbs and adjectives, it provides our students with an exciting intellectual challenge and is a welcome addition to the other languages and subjects on offer at our school.

It is also an exciting and challenging experience for the teacher!

I'd like to thank Ms Andre and the LOTE Faculty staff for their unflinching support and enthusiasm in embracing something new, dynamic and innovative at our school.

I wish everyone the best for a great start to the term and into this new academic year for Randwick Girls High School.






