Our finalists left us in awe with their highly innovative app concepts, stellar visual designs, and impressive presentation skills. Their dedication and hard work were evident as they presented their ideas to the upcoming Year 7 cohort, who are poised to embark on this exciting project. The panel of judges, including Dr. Malgorzata Lagizs from UNSW, UX/UI designer Miranda Rector, and our student judge Shark, (Unatti, Year 11) provided invaluable feedback and guidance. Special commendation goes to Shark, whose infectious energy, dance moves, and 'fintastic' feedback left a lasting impression on us all. We are immensely proud to witness the growth of our students as they embrace challenges, acquire new skills, and build their confidence through initiatives like these. Thank you to the GITI staff for facilitating this program, as well as to the judges and students who participated. A special thanks goes to Ms Hall (Relieving HT Creative Arts) for her organisation of the event, whose unwavering

support continues to fuel the success of this program and event.

The past fortnight has also been full of successes on the sporting front. In particular, I'd like to acknowledge the school's Open Netball team who have successfully progressed to the Sydney East Netball Knockout Grand Final. Last week, our team was victorious against an excellent competitor, Kirrawee High School, in the semifinal of the Sydney East Knockout competition. This amazing achievement is a first for our school, and a real credit to Ms Thornton and the team for all their hard work and dedication to get to this very high level. We wish our team all the very best, and whatever the outcome acknowledge the amazing dedication, team work and effort that all have demonstrated to get to this level. Well done!

Last week our Year 12's, along with Ms Evers, Ms Nelmes, Ms Vo, Ms Bournes and Ms Thornton, attended the 2024 HSC Careers Expo. Held at the Royal Randwick Racecourse, this invaluable experience allowed students in their final year the opportunity to engage with a variety of post school education providers, including various universities, private colleges and TAFE. I would like to thank Ms Evers for her organisation of this invaluable opportunity for our students to guide their decision making in regard to their post school destinations.

To mark this year's National Reconciliation Week, our school's First Nations Team has been busy preparing events to support this important initiative. On Thursday, students from Year 10, 11 and 12 attended the Kinchela Boys Truth Telling Session, a program led by members of the Stolen Generation. This powerful and moving event highlights the significance of the reconciliation process, through the lens of educating students on the impact of the Stolen Generation policies and practices. This was followed on Friday with our whole school Reconciliation Assembly, where the school community came together to mark National Reconciliation Week. A special thanks to Ms Jansen, Ms Hall and all members of the First Nations Team for organising these important events.

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Dear parents and carers,

I apologise that it has been such a long time since the last update, I hope that this letter provides you with some clarity about the progress that has been made toward our new coeducational Randwick High School next year.

School Name and Logo

You would be aware already that the school's name 'Randwick High School' and logo were finalised some time ago. The new logo can be seen at the top of this letterhead. The tagline 'learning today, leading tomorrow' is a placeholder until the new school Principal Belinda Conway has time to work through the vision with the school community. This was the most popular tagline put forward so we will run with it until such time as a new school motto/tagline is developed.

New School Uniform

It has been confirmed that the Department will undertake a licence agreement with Midford Uniform suppliers. The new junior uniform will be available for the 2025 Year 7 cohort and the senior uniform will be available for Year 11 2025. All other students will remain in the current Randwick Boys and Randwick Girls uniforms in 2025. Lowes and Wileys will continue to sell existing uniform stock so that the new uniform can be phased in over a number of years as each new year 7 cohort arrives and as Year 10 graduate into year 11. Midford has put forward very competitive pricing and high-quality garments. I would like to thank all the students and parents who participated in the uniform surveys and who have tried on samples and styles. We hope that you will be as excited about the new uniforms as we are.

Whilst the final design is still being tweaked with the P&C, the basic colour scheme for the new uniform will be sky blue, dark charcoal and navy blue for juniors (the skirt will be charcoal with aqua and white pin stripes) and for seniors white, charcoal and navy with aqua detail. Storyboards have been presented at both P&C meetings and individual pieces that will make up the new uniform should be available for parents and students to see soon. There will be a blazer for formal occasions, but this will not be compulsory. There will be both a knitted jumper and a winter jacket.

Student Enrolment Numbers

At this early stage there has been a healthy intake of students enrolling into Randwick High School for Year 7 2025 with close to 50:50 boys and girls. There will be a total enrolment 7-12 of approximately 1400 students in 2025. Students in Year 6 last Saturday also sat an HPGE test for entry into one of the Year 7 HPGE classes for next year. As both Randwick Girls and Randwick Boys have HPGE classes in Years 7-10 the students already in these classes will continue in the HPGE classes through to the end of year 10 although they will be mixed classes of boys and girls from next year onwards.

Classes and Curriculum

Whilst there will be more classes in each year group from next year and beyond, class sizes will not be affected. These will be capped at a maximum of 30 students or less for non-practical subjects in years 7-10 and 24 or less in Years 11-12. All students will have classes in both sides of the new school and they will also have access to all of the combined facilities across the entire school. The school will not have reduced staffing numbers, the number of teaching positions will remain the same as it is currently. Staff numbers will only increase if student enrolments increase.

All current curriculum offerings at both schools will be offered to all students choosing junior electives and HSC courses for 2025. Students will study three electives in Year 9 and two electives in year 10. All classes will be co-ed in 2025 except for History and Geography in Year 8 and some electives in Year 10. All year 12 classes in 2025 will remain single sex with their current teachers unless staff members retire or move to another school. Year 12 students in 2025 will be the last cohort to graduate under the names of Randwick Girls and Randwick Boys and their NESA entries will be kept discreet.

A year 8 and 10 student and parent subject selection night has been scheduled for the first week of Term 3, Thursday 25 July. This will be an opportunity for parents to meet the new Principal of Randwick High School. Detailed information about this evening will be sent to year 8 and 10 students and parents later this term.

Bell Times

A 6-period day will be kept in place for 2025 and the new school bell times will hopefully be shared very soon, there will be minimal change to the existing bell times. The current 20-minute recess and



40-minute lunch will also remain in place. It is possible that the sport afternoon may change to a different day, we are unsure yet which grade sport zone Randwick High School will participate in but there will be a sport afternoon. School buses will also remain the same.

Student events

Following the successful student wellbeing program delivered to Year 8 by 'Human Connections' organised by Ms Whitty and Mr Benson earlier this term, a similar event has been booked for Year 7 in term 4 - 1^{st} November. The combined PDHPE department is organising a gala day for year 9 in term $3 - 6^{th}$ August and all year groups will participate in combined new school information sessions, meet the new Principal and trivia competitions on the last two days of this term – Thursday 4^{th} July and Friday 5^{th} July. Further opportunities for the boys and girls in each year group to meet each other will be provided in Terms 3 and 4 this year.

In term 4 all students will be taken in class groups to tour the other side of the school which they are not yet familiar with. Initial dates have been booked for 2025 including a Year 7 Camp to Collaroy, whole school carnivals, school photos etc. All events and extra-curricular opportunities that are currently on offer at each school will continue to be offered but to all students.

Building Works

Behind the scenes we are working on the new school website and this will go live at the end of term 2. Digital Field Services are planning to install new cables across the site to connect students and staff to a new server, internet and telephony service by the end of this school year. We hope that this upgrade will improve the internet connection and speed currently experienced. There will also be a new PA and bells system installed which will operate across the entire site ready for day 1 next year.

There is a plan in place for what building works will be done in time for day 1 term 1 2025. Rather than referring to the 'girls' school' and the 'boys' school' in project plans the infrastructure team and school assets are currently referring to the southern end (current boys' school) and the northern end (current girls' school) of the site. Temporary school maps will be developed for 2025 so that students, staff, parents and contractors can find their way around the new school. These will be updated as new buildings are completed:

- Signage with the new branding will be installed at the front of the school. Wayfinding signs will also be installed around the school site for the commencement of 2025.
- The school fence will be removed at the end of this school year. I know that some staff, parents and students have expressed an interest for this to take place earlier, but we need to maintain students on their own school grounds unless under the supervision of staff who are responsible for them when visiting the other site throughout this year.
- There will be one canteen on the southern end of the school site in 2025. Works have commenced on the current canteen to extend this building to create a larger canteen with more serving windows with works due to be completed next term. The current canteen provider will continue running the new school canteen into 2025.



- There will be boys' and girls' toilets and changerooms on both the southern and northern ends of the school site as well as male, female and unisex toilets for staff on both sides of the school site and in the middle of the school site (currently A Block).
- Staff will be housed together in Faculty groups in three main staffrooms across the entire school.
- For the commencement of 2025 all administration and reception will be relocated to Barker Street whilst the administration and staff building on the southern side is demolished.
- Both School Halls will be kept along with the gymnasium. There will be only one school library which will be on the northern side. The current boys school library will be refurbished to become specialist performance spaces for Music and Drama.

New buildings will be built off Rainbow Street commencing sometime in 2025 along with upgrades and refurbishments to some of the existing classrooms and specialist teaching spaces. New covered walkways are planned to connect both extremes of the school.

Construction work will not take place before the HSC. Workers onsite will liaise closely with the school staff to ensure minimal disruption to learning. **Schools Infrastructure is planning a community presentation Wednesday 3rd July from 3pm – 5pm** at which they will display project plans for staff, parents and students. We hope to have uniform storyboards and perhaps some uniform samples also on display at this presentation. Further details about this event will be communicated with parents and students closer to the date.

New School Principal

The new Randwick High School Principal Belinda Conway will commence next week following the long weekend on Tuesday 11 June, she will be joining me in the A Block office where we will work together until the end of this term. There will be an additional student free day at the beginning of term 3 and this will take place on Tuesday 23 July. Students will return to school in Term 3 on Wednesday 24 July. Ms Conway will address each year group on the last two days of this term.

I hope this provides greater clarity about what your school will look like in 2025. As further details are decided these will be communicated with students, staff and parents.
